Chair Nina Fialkow called the meeting to order at 10:04am and asked Deputy Director David Slatery to read the Open Meeting Law statement:

This meeting shall be open and accessible to all members of the public except at such times when this body has voted to go into closed executive session under the Open Meeting Law.

This meeting is a virtual meeting held under the Open Meeting Law as modified under current law to permit online open meetings. This meeting is being broadcast to the public on a publicly available YouTube or other channel as described in the publicly posted meeting notice. Only Council members, staff and invited participants and guests will be provided access to the Zoom or other videoconferencing platform hosting the meeting. As a safety measure, to prevent disruption of the meeting or non-public communications among the participants, the Chair, Vice Chair and Executive Committee of Mass Cultural Council has asked staff to implement the following protocols for participants in on-line meetings of Mass Cultural Council or its committees:

- Any "chat" or similar function on the Zoom platform hosting the meeting shall be disabled.
- Other than Council members or participants specifically recognized by the Chair of the meeting, all Zoom platform participants will be muted and have no ability to share media or documents or project or type images or text.
- All participants in the Zoom platform must enter a waiting room and digitally sign-in before being admitted.
- Any attendee in the Zoom platform who nonetheless causes a disruption will be summarily removed from the meeting at the discretion of the Chair.

Draft minutes of the open session of this meeting shall be kept and shall be posted on Mass Cultural Council's website no later than 30 days after the meeting provided that such minutes shall not be considered official until they have been approved by this body in open session. Individuals asserting a violation of the Open Meeting Law may file a complaint with this body within 30 days or with the Attorney General's office thereafter.

Executive Director Michael Bobbitt then reminded Council Members that there would be a Mission Moment at the beginning of all Council Meetings to spotlight a Massachusetts artist, program, or organization. Today, bootmaker and Traditional Arts fellowship recipient Sarah Guerin was in attendance and gave a thoughtful presentation about her work. Staff also shared an excerpt from a [short film](#) the Agency recently made about Sarah.

Nina then asked Council Members if they'd had a chance to review the Minutes from their last meeting on May 23 and, if so, she would look for a motion to approve them. Jo-Ann Davis moved to approve the minutes, and Kathleen Castro seconded the motion. By roll call vote and noting that Karen Barry, Karen Hurvitz, Simone Early, Ann Murphy, and Lillian Do were absent it was

RESOLVED: that the Council approves the minutes of the May 23, 2022 Council Meeting in the form presented to the Council.

Nina called the Council's attention to the calendar of upcoming meetings in their meeting materials, then asked Executive Director Michael Bobbitt for his report.

Michael gave a brief update noting that staff has been busy creating the FY23 spending plan. He thanked the BIPOC Outreach Coordinator team, the Cultural Equity and Access Initiatives team, and Public Affairs for their work on the recruitment front. He noted that after only 10 days open, the Recovery Grants for Individuals program has 1,013 applications and 94% of them are from new applicants or applicants who have not received a grant in the last six years and 74% are BIPOC. Additionally, 80 organizations have applied to the Recovery Grants for Organizations program; 85% are new applicants. Staff will continue recruitment work.

Nina asked Michael for an update on the strategic plan.

Michael thanked the Task Force and David Slatery for their efforts. Fourteen applications were received and narrowed to three finalists; an offer was made to Dorchester-based Strategy Matters. David is revising their scope of work, and the project will begin in the fall.

Nina then asked Public Affairs Director Bethann Steiner for her Advocacy report.

Bethann noted that the legislature's formal session ended late on August 1. Between now and the end of the calendar year they will convene informally two times per week. The Agency's big point of pride is the success of its budget advocacy strategy which resulted in a \$23.4M appropriation. This is the largest appropriation since 1987. In FY23, Mass Cultural Council has just under \$100M to invest between its appropriation, gaming mitigation funds, recovery funds, and the Cultural Facilities Fund. Bethann reported that she and Michael met with 66% of the legislature – 200 legislators – 160 House Members and 40 Senators.

Nina then asked Catherine Cheng-Anderson for her Cultural Equity and Access report.

In alignment with one of the internal goals of the Racial Equity Plan, and the Massachusetts Pay Equity law; Catherine conducted a good faith, reasonable self-evaluation of Mass Cultural Council's pay practices and completed the Pay Equity Act Assessment ahead of schedule.

Catherine let Council members know that this was a huge undertaking for her as she was also learning about Mass Cultural Council's business operations, grantmaking activities, and services over the past year.

Catherine has developed a new standardized manager classification system and placed each one of the Agency's managers in an appropriate job

classification with clearly defined and transparent pay structures.

Earlier this summer staff were notified that this work was completed, and Catherine has operationalized into her workflow periodic salary review to ensure continued equity in the approach the Agency takes to pay its staff. Catherine thanked the Agency's managers and staff for their support and patience as she completed this review. She then asked Program Officer for Access & Inclusion Charles Baldwin to give his update.

Charles explained that he has been leading the UP Initiative since 2016. He was delighted when the Cultural Equity & Access department was established and UP was brought into it. In his thinking for FY23, Charles considered how the work he does would be embedded into the Agency's equity practices. A good deal of listening and learning more about equitable grantmaking has taken effect. Small grants to organizations who have gone through the Innovation & Learning Network have been eliminated. The grant amounts (\$1K and \$3K) were too low to be paired with such an arduous application and reporting process. Charles has proposed annual funding for the five years of an UP Designation; amounts may vary. Charles is also looking at how the Agency and the program can encompass and embody the principles of disability justice. A plan will be created to address this.

Program Officer for Equity & Inclusion Cheyenne Cohn-Postell then explained that she would provide the Council with a summary of FY22 efforts around racial equity. All grant programs have gone through or are going through a racial equity audit. The changes are exciting. Cheyenne let Council Members know that 58% of the Cultural Facilities Fund panelists self-identified as people of color, and 61% of reviewers within Artist Fellowships self-identified as BIPOC. Staff will continue to strive for more representation. In terms of applications from individuals and organizations who are new to the Agency, 70% of applicants within the AAPI recovery program were new; 38% of Festivals applicants were new; 31% of Artist Fellowship applicants were new. Outreach and recruitment efforts are continuing; 131 people connected with members of the BIPOC Outreach Coordinator team in the first six months; 382 people submitted written comments around the Agency's ARPA allocation. Email open rates are at 54% so staff knows that when they are meeting new people, those people are properly engaged.

Nina thanked Catherine, Charles, and Cheyenne for their report, then asked Michael, David, and Operations Director Jen Lawless to give their financial report focused on the FY23 budget and spending plan.

Michael then delivered a presentation on the Agency's budget and spending plan for FY23. A copy of the presentation Michael gave is available upon request.

After Michael read the presentation, there were a few questions from the Council.

Allyce Najimy asked what the Zero Net Gain Workshop is. Jen explained that the Cultural Facilities Fund team would work with organizations map a path towards zero emissions.

Allyce asked why Artist Fellowship grants were being paused. Michael explained that the Agency typically funds 150 artists, plus the Traditional Arts Apprenticeships, and that this was an opportune year to pause and review the program as the Agency will be using \$15 million in Pandemic Recovery Funds from the legislature to separately fund 3,000 artists via the Cultural Sector Recovery Grants for Individuals program (which was approved by the Council at the last meeting). The team is working to review how the program works and affect Massachusetts artists and cultural practitioners and looking at expanding eligibility to include historically overlooked artists such as drag artists, DJs, and many more types of artists who do not fit the current Fellowship categories. The reason for this is to align the Fellowships program with the Agency's racial equity goals.

Allyce asked if this meant the Agency would bring the Fellowships back in January and Michael explained that the program would not return until next year, hopefully with an increase to its funding.

Allyce asked if musicians could apply next year, Jen explained that if Allyce knows a network of musicians, they should look into applying for the Recovery Grants for Individuals program.

Allyce asked if the Cultural Facilities Fund would be run in FY23 since it was not part of the presentation. Michael explained that the CFF is not funded through the Agency's Spending Plan- rather that MassDevelopment actually funds the grants with an allocation from the Governor's annual Capital Plan. The next round of CFF funding will open in October and he highlighted a new rule: organizations who receive a grant must then take one year off before applying again. Allyce asked if this was for all CFF grants or just capital and was told it was just for capital grants- not the CFF Planning Grants.

Matthew Keator asked when the Agency's lease on its office space was up. David explained that it would end in January 2026 and that in the next year staff would start a planning process for its next space with the Commonwealth's leasing office at DCAM.

There were no further questions. The Chair then let Council Members know that the Executive Committee had reviewed the FY23 spending plan and recommends it for approval. She explained that she would seek a motion and a second and then Grants Chair Jo-Ann Davis would walk Council Members

through specific grant recommendations and answer any questions Council Members had. Then, there would be one vote on the spending plan and all grant recommendations. Troy Siebels moved to approve the spending plan. Allyce Najimy seconded the motion. Nina then asked Jo-Ann to begin her presentation of the grant recommendations.

Before Jo-Ann began, David reminded Council Members that in their Meeting Book they would find a Conflict-of-Interest List and asked if there were any additions. There were no additions or changes to be made and it was noted that all votes approving the FY23 grant recommendations will note the various possible conflicts and abstentions of the Council Members in attendance at this meeting.

The following abstentions were noted:

Nina Fialkow disclosed that she would abstain from any discussion or vote regarding the provision of a grant or other assistance to Boston Ballet and Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum.

Marc Carroll disclosed that he would abstain from any discussion or vote regarding the provision of a grant or other assistance to Boston Youth Symphony Orchestra or The Rivers School.

Barbara Schaffer Bacon disclosed that she would abstain from any discussion or vote regarding the provision of a grant or other assistance to the Arts Extension Service.

Jo-Ann Davis disclosed that she would abstain from any discussion or vote regarding the provision of a grant or other assistance to MASSCreative, Springfield Museums, and The Care Center.

Kathleen Castro disclosed that she would abstain from any discussion or vote regarding the provision of a grant or other assistance to the Little Theater of Fall River or the New Bedford Festival Theater and the Fall River Coalition for Arts & Culture.

Cecil Barron Jensen disclosed that she would abstain from any discussion or vote regarding the provision of a grant or other assistance to the Artists Association of Nantucket, The Nantucket Historical Association, or Nantucket Cultural District.

Che Anderson disclosed that he would abstain from any discussion or vote regarding the provision of a grant or other assistance to Mechanics Hall, Worcester Art Museum, Worcester Historical Museum, and the Institute of Contemporary Art (ICA).

Jo-Ann then proceeded with her presentation and let Council Members know that in addition to the presentation Michael gave, there are exhaustive materials in their Meeting Book. She thanked the staff for their amazing work taking a fresh look at the grantmaking process and let the Council know that the Grants Committee had thoroughly reviewed all grant recommendations and the process through which the recommendations were determined. Jo-Ann then asked for a motion to approve the FY23 grant recommendations explaining again that there would be one vote on those recommendations and the spending plan at the conclusion of her presentation. Kathleen Castro moved to approve the grant recommendations, and Cecil Barron Jensen seconded the motion. Jo-Ann then asked Artists Program Manager Dan Blask and Program Officer Maggie Holtzberg to give their presentation on Traditional Artist Fellowships. Together they walked the Council through a brief PowerPoint presentation about the teachers and apprentices noting that it is a very large cohort. A copy of the presentation is available upon request. Maggie is thrilled to note that there is an 80% increase and Michael added that the guidelines had been changed so that apprentices would be paid.

Barbara Schaffer Bacon asked if there might be a map developed so that Council Members could see where the teachers and apprentices are from, and Maggie stated that staff would love to do this in the future.

Jo-Ann thanked Dan and Maggie for their presentation which brought to light all the incredible work being done in Massachusetts, how its being passed on; she also loved Sarah Guerin's presentation at the beginning of the meeting noting the craftsmanship, history, and themes. Jo-Ann asked if Council Members had any questions, and they did not. That concluded the presentation on grants.

The Chair explained that at this point the Council would take one vote on the FY23 spending plan and grant recommendations together. David added that there are 11 Council members present and that with the abstentions, 10 members would vote on every grant. He then did a roll call noting that Karen Barry, Karen Hurvitz, Simon Early, Ann Murphy, and Lillian Do were absent. The votes were unanimous, and

WHEREAS, the General Court of the Massachusetts State Legislature has appropriated a budget of \$22,377,000 to the Mass Cultural Council for FY23; AND

WHEREAS Mass Cultural Council staff has presented a draft FY23 budget and spending plan to the Executive Committee at its meeting on August 5, 2022;

WHEREAS the Executive Committee reviewed said plan and recommended that it be forwarded to the Council for approval;

WHEREAS Council staff presented the Plan to the Mass Cultural Council at its meeting on August 25, 2022.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby

RESOLVED: To approve the Plan as presented at the Council Meeting and attached hereto, subject to the further approvals of the individual grant and program recommendations to be considered and voted upon the Council later in this meeting; and

RESOLVED: To make available funds from gaming tax revenues contained in the Massachusetts Cultural and Performing Arts Mitigation Trust Fund and Pandemic Recovery Funds provided under Chapter 102 of the Acts of 2021 to be spent in FY23 in the manner set forth in the Plan.

Section 10-22 Grant Recommendations (Section numbers refer to sections of the Council Meeting Book which is available on the Council's website)

WHEREAS Council staff presented the grants portion of the Plan to the Grants Committee at its meeting on August 5, 2022 ("Grants Committee Meeting"), in connection with recommended grant allocations;

WHEREAS the Grants Committee recommended to the full Council the allocation of the grants presented at the Grants Committee Meeting;

WHEREAS the Grants Committee reviewed procedures of grant allocations and recommended that the Council approve the same;

Section 10 RESOLVED: To approve the funding of the Apprentice Grants program in the amount of \$180,000 as recommended by the Grants Committee.

Section 11 RESOLVED: To approve allocations to the Cultural Investment Portfolio and CIP Gateway programs as recommended by the Grants Committee for an aggregate total of \$6,996,300.

Section 12 RESOLVED: To approve the third cycle of the Gaming Mitigation Program as recommended by the Grants Committee.

Section 13 RESOLVED: To approve an allocation to the Local Cultural Councils totaling \$5,500,000 and up to \$825,000 in Cultural District grants as recommended by the Grants Committee.

Section 14 RESOLVED: To approve the new Festivals & Projects program totaling \$1,375,000 as recommended by the Grants Committee.

Section 15 RESOLVED: To approve grant allocations to YouthReach program in the amount of \$1,892,000, continued funding of the Instrument Library in the amount of \$30,000 and participation in the META and CYP Teaching Artist Fellowships program with outside foundations and provision of up to \$120,000 in grants/stipends/reimbursements to participating organizations in the CultureRX

Social Prescription program and \$30,416 to the Youth Arts Impact Network with EdVestors, all as recommended by the Grants Committee.

RESOLVED: To approve the following Arts Education grant allocations, \$1,401,250 to the STARS program, \$20,000 in support of Massachusetts History Day and \$20,000 in support of the NEA-funded Poetry Out Loud program, all as recommended by the Grants Committee.

Section 16 RESOLVED: To approve the continuation of the UP Program with grants of up to \$496,000 as recommended by the Grants Committee.

Section 17 RESOLVED: To approve a \$125,000 grant to Arts Connect International for underwriting 500 Massachusetts cultural sector participants in its Cultural Equity Learning Community (CELC) 2.0 teaching course as recommended by the Grants Committee.

Section 18 RESOLVED: To approve a grant to Mass Humanities totaling \$849,247 and an allocation of \$2.5 Million in Pandemic Recovery Funds, all as recommended by the Grants Committee.

Section 19 RESOLVED: To approve Council a grant to NEFA of \$70,000 as recommended by the Grants Committee Meeting.

Section 20 RESOLVED: To approve a grant to Mass Creative for \$100,000 to commission a cultural data impact report and to continue improve their online community engagement portal, all as recommended by the Grants Committee.

Section 21 RESOLVED: To approve an allocation of \$70,000 to ArtsBoston acting on behalf of the Network Arts Administrators of Color as recommended the Grants Committee.

Section 22 RESOLVED: To approve \$100,000 in Media Transition Grants to- 5 public media companies, all as recommended by the Grants Committee.

Nina thanked Agency staff and her fellow Council Members for their time and energy to make sure citizens of the Commonwealth are served by Mass Cultural Council. Troy echoed Nina's comments and added that it would be a good deal of work to invest this level of funding.

Michael added that staff is working very hard on recruitment and told Council Members about a QR code card developed by the Public Affairs team that was part of the materials staff created to enhance recruitment and communication efforts this fiscal year. Allyce asked if the code could be emailed, Communications and Community Engagement Manager Carmen Plazas explained that the code could not be emailed, but the links the code represented could be shared.

There was no further business and no further questions and Nina, as Chair, adjourned the meeting at 11:28am.

Executive Committee. The Executive Committee met on January 11 to recommend a re-allocation of Pandemic Recovery Funds between the two Cultural Sector Recovery Grant programs and approve the agenda for today's Council meeting.

Grants Committee. The Grants Committee also met on January 11 to review staff's recommendations with respect to the Cultural Sector Recovery Grants programs and unanimously recommend them for approval by the full Council today.

New Council Member. We happy to report that Dr. Barbara Krauthamer, Dean of the College of Humanities and Fine Arts at UMass Amherst [was appointed to the Council by Governor Baker last November](#). The Chair, Vice Chair and staff conducted a Council Member Orientation on January 10 and today will be Barbara's first meeting.

LEGISLATIVE, ADVOCACY AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS

Advocacy Report. A reflection on our advocacy victories during the 2021-2023 legislative session is available online in the Power of Culture Blog. We are proud to note our efforts secured unprecedented and historic levels of state investment for the sector in the budget, capital spending plan, and pandemic recovery spending plan, as well as passage of long-proposed legislation that both clarifies and simplifies who is eligible to serve on a Local Cultural Council: <https://massculturalcouncil.org/blog/reflecting-on-our-advocacy-campaign-victories/>

The 193rd Session of the Massachusetts General Court began on January 4, 2023. This two-year legislative session will span calendar years 2023 and 2024. The House of Representatives has 22 new members, while the Massachusetts State

Senate has 5 new members. Speaker Ron Mariano of Quincy will once again lead the House, while Senate President Karen Spilka will lead the Senate. It is expected that both the Speaker and President will announce their leadership teams and committee chairs, vice chairs and memberships early this year.

Mass Cultural Council has taken steps to build relationships with these new legislators. We have reached out to congratulate them, share information on our grant programs and the grant investments recently made in their communities, and offered to meet with them and their staff to brief them on the Agency and answer any questions they may have.

Legislators will soon begin to file bills for consideration in this new session. The Rules state that timely filed bills must be filed with the House and Senate Clerks by the close of business on the third Friday in January – January 20, 2023. Mass Cultural Council will review these proposals and take note of any that are relevant to the cultural sector.

The Healey/Driscoll Administration was sworn in on January 5, 2023. Michael attended the inaugural celebration that evening at the Boston Garden, and we helped the committee planning the event connect with various cultural performers. Michael has a relationship with the new Governor, and we look forward to building a strong working relationship with the new Administration. Our congratulatory correspondence after the election was received and Michael received word from Governor Healey that she intends to support the sector during her time in office.

The FY24 budget cycle will begin a little later than usual this year because it is Governor Healey's first year in office. While the Governor's budget, H. 1, is normally due within three weeks of the convening of the General Court, in her first year of office she has 8 weeks to prepare her spending plan. It is expected that the Governor's budget will be submitted to the House and Senate by March 1, 2023, and that the House and Senate Committees on Ways & Means will then begin to hold hearings on the proposal. Mass Cultural Council will use the budget hearing as a chance to outline and build support for our FY24 funding request, which has not yet been determined and will soon be discussed with Council Members, the Advocacy Committee, Senior Leadership, and our advocacy partners.

Public Events. Since August, the Agency has hosted several public events including Cultural Facilities Fund grant celebrations in Easthampton (9/14), Lowell (9/19), Plymouth (9/28), and Fall River (10/18) and a more recent event celebrating the Cultural Districts Initiative in Framingham on January 6th. All events were well-attended and earned coverage in local news media.

The Agency is planning to hold an event on February 15th at 11am in Nurses Hall at the State House to announce and celebrate Cultural Sector Recovery Grants for Organizations and Individuals. This will be followed by a series of regional celebrations in March and April. Full details for the event at the State House and the regional events will be shared with Council Members soon.

CULTURAL INVESTMENT PORTFOLIO (CIP)

Cultural Investment Portfolio plans. Fourteen organizations took advantage of the alternative reporting system that we developed for their FY22 final reports. As of this time, three organizations still need to complete reporting, and we expect that to be complete by January 31. As we move past the midpoint of FY23, we are developing plans for FY23 year-end reporting requirements, and we are continuing to develop plans for implementing the revisions to the Portfolio grant program starting in FY24.

Activities. Although the CIP team has not been conducting site visits, we continue to provide consultations with CIP organizations and potential applicants through online platforms.

Cultural Sector Recovery Grant Program. The CIP team took the lead on constituent support, leading information sessions, office hours, and one on one support for applicants to the Recovery program. We used an email system for the team to work with constituent inquiries and implemented an online calendaring software to support applicants which was greatly successful, and we hope to use this as a model for applicant support for future grant programs. The program received close to 1400 applications, and the CIP, supported by temporary Agency employees, reviewed the applications, and supported the applicants in revising their applications which will provide the best possible outcomes for the applications.

Card to Culture. There are now 378 cultural organizations offering free or discounted admissions to cultural activities for Massachusetts residents of limited means. Some of the increase (74 new participating organizations) is due to Festivals & Projects grant program, which prioritizes organizations that are participating in the program. Program Officer Greg Torrales has developed robust plans for working with the partner agencies to promote the Card to Culture program by providing timely information for the agencies to provide to the participants and is supporting cultural organizations in their participation by helping them with messaging and website presence for their programs.

Gaming Mitigation. The Gaming Mitigation program opened for applications on October 19, 2022, and Program Officer Lillian Lee conducted an informational webinar, followed by office hours, one on one consulting. Outreach was done in collaboration with program staff from other teams, with over 700 organizations across the Commonwealth being reached through various email campaigns. A total of 44 applications were successfully submitted to the FY23 Gaming Mitigation Program cycle, 5 are new to the program, and there was a 95% retention rate of FY22 Gaming Mitigation grantees. We originally estimated that there would be \$3.5 million available for funding this cycle, but the actual amount available for funding is \$3,737,445. At this time, we anticipate being able to meet our original timeline and determine award amounts this month.

(January) with contracts being mailed to grantees in late January/early February.

FESTIVALS & PROJECTS

(a collaborative program of the CIP and Communities teams)

CIP Program Officer Kalyn King worked with Communities Program Officer Timothea Pham to develop the Festivals & Projects program, working across teams which the Agency has not typically done.

The application for Mass Cultural Council's FY23 Festivals and Projects grants closed on December 15, 2022. We received 790 applications, more than double the amount received in the prior grant cycles for the former Festivals program and former Projects grants. We anticipate funding 550 festivals and projects, with an allocation of \$1,375,000 authorized in the Agency's FY23 Spending Plan.

The FY23 grant cycle combined the previously separate Festivals and Projects programs into one and increased Festivals and Projects grants from \$1500 to \$2,500 and provides for awards based on eligibility and the prioritization categories listed below.

- First-time applicants or applicants who have not received funding from Mass Cultural Council in the last three fiscal years (including from the Cultural Sector Recovery Grants for Organizations).
- Applicants and projects representing communities who have been historically underfunded, including:
 - Applicants that self-identify as "BIPOC-Centered," according to Mass Cultural Council's definition.
 - Applicants/projects located in cities and towns that Mass Cultural Council has defined as "under-resourced communities."
- Applicants participating in the Agency's Card to Culture programs.
- Projects/events that are free to the public.

Of the 790 applications received:

- 460 of the organizations have not received funding from us in the last three years, including previously unsuccessful applicants and new applicants.
- At least 106 are from BIPOC-centered organizations (some BIPOC-centered self-identification forms are still in the process of being reviewed.)
- 297 would fund programs taking place in a priority community.
- 474 are from applicants for whom this Festivals & Projects grant (if received) would be their only grant from the Mass Cultural Council in FY23.
- 103 applicants are participating in the Card to Culture program.

- 604 programs are listed as free to the public.

Applications are being reviewed for eligibility now, and grant announcements will be made in late February 2023.

COMMUNITY INITIATIVE

The Community Initiative consists of the Local Cultural Council (LCC) Program, The Cultural District Initiative and part of the Festivals and Projects program outlined above. There are currently seven staff members working on the team – one manager and six program officers.

Since the beginning of FY23, the Communities Team has successfully completed the LCC grant cycle (September 1-October 17, 2022), the Cultural Districts Grant Program, and the Festivals and Projects grant cycle.

The Communities Initiative team is responsible for providing support, advice, and training to the 329 cultural councils in the Commonwealth. This year we brought on four new members of the team bringing our number to seven, which has made a tremendous difference in our ability to provide much needed support to the field. Each team member (except for the Program Manager) works with between 55-58 LCCs, as well as with the Cultural Districts that are located within their cities or towns. The team will also be helping to support the Festival and Projects Grant program in the coming months.

LCC Program. The LCC program successfully completed the FY23 grant cycle on October 17th, 2022. Due to outreach from both the Councils and the Mass Cultural Council, the LCC program received 11,596 applications this year, a record number and more than any prior year. (Last year we received 10,231) Currently the LCCs are reviewing grants and working toward completing their Annual Reports. Communities team is working to help the LCCs complete the reports and keep them on track to grant out their funds for FY23.

In addition, we are currently working on a survey to send to LCC members regarding the past year's grant cycle. We will be following that up with a survey to applicants. Once the LCC grant cycle is completed for all 329 Cultural Councils, we will be able to tabulate the exact amount of grants that were awarded from the program. We anticipate this to take place by March 1, 2023.

Cultural Districts. Fifty districts successfully applied for this year's round of CDI grants of \$15,000, totaling \$750,000; a 100% increase from last year's funding amount and the largest CDI investment to-date. These grants will support our sectoral leaders in stabilizing themselves, as well as their partners, communities, and constituents, through the ongoing and after-effects of the pandemic, as well as in implementing initiatives in areas pivotal to their growth and sustainability such as strategic and cultural planning and development,

marketing and engagement, regional and collaborative programming, and equity and access initiatives, among others.

New Cultural Districts. We are proposing two new Cultural Districts for approval at the January Council Meeting: Town of Harwich – 1.) Harwich Port Cultural District, and 2.) Harwich Center Cultural District. We intend to bring two additional districts for approval at the March Council meeting: Town of Cummington - Cummington Cultural District, and Town of Lexington – Lexington Cultural District.

Prospective Cultural Districts. Staff continues to field inquiries from, and/or has met with stakeholders in, Holyoke, East Somerville, Amesbury, Brookline, Rockland, Adams, Melrose, Ipswich, Danvers, Deerfield and Truro. Staff will hold meetings, both virtual and in-person, throughout the coming months, to assess and support these prospective municipalities.

Cultural District Application. Updates have been incorporated into the application process for new districts, with a focus on accessibility, inclusivity, and programming beneficial to communities. Language has changed for proposed district maps, considering ‘navigability’ over ‘walkability.’ Formal site visits are now more effective and efficient, bringing together municipal representatives and the community for one shared, collaborative experience rather than individualized conversations. Revisions have also been made to our site assessment reports to ensure they highlight areas of potential and attainable opportunity, recognize the value and effort of each creative and cultural community, and provide a set of tangible goals that can be pursued for the district.

Designation Renewals. In line with new procedural protocol for districts working through their fifth year of designation, Program Officers continue to meet, virtually and in-person, with district leaders and partners to assess their successes, challenges and needs to ensure they are being properly supported as they progress.

Ongoing program requirements have been revised to evolve with current agency policies and practices. Now, during their 10-year designation period, districts are required to provide a Racial Equity Statement of Commitment to coincide with annual reporting obligations and are encouraged to contribute to our developing Community of Practice. Districts are also expected to take part in 2-4 Learning Communities over the 10-year period with a focus on promoting access, equity, diversity, and inclusion.

Cultural District Tenth Anniversary Campaign. The Agency is embarking on a CDI 10th Anniversary campaign over the coming months to celebrate the program’s 14 inaugural districts reaching their 10-year designation milestone. This multi-faceted campaign is set to involve cohesive components that include

blog posts and press releases, a collective and accessible digital marketing strategy, and public events and speaking engagements.

ARTISTS

Cultural Sector Recovery Grants for Individuals. Pending approval by the governing Council, the Agency is preparing to announce the results of the Cultural Sector Recovery Grants, including \$20 million, or 4,000 grants of \$5,000, awarded to individual artists, teaching artists/humanists/scientists, and cultural workers.

The planning, design, and administration of the program has been an Agency-wide effort. Please watch for more information about potential announcement/celebration events in the weeks ahead.

Lani Asuncion. As part of the Agency's work in administering the Cultural Sector Recovery Grants, Lani Asuncion joined the Artist Department in August as a Temporary Program Officer. Lani worked diligently to counsel applicants, review applications for eligibility, and support the work of the team and the Agency.

Lani's work with the Artists Team concludes at the end of January. On behalf of Mass Cultural Council, the Artist Team extends gratitude and appreciation to Lani for their deeply meaningful contributions to the cultural sector.

Seal and Motto Commission. Kelly Bennett was the Mass Cultural Council's representative on the [Special Commission on the Official Seal and Motto of the Commonwealth](#). The commission was charged with reviewing and making recommendations on the Massachusetts's official state seal and motto. The Commission submitted an Interim Report on December 31, 2022. As of January 1, 2023, the Seal and Motto Commission was formally dissolved. They are assessing the legislative options available to revive the Commission in the new legislative session.

Folk Arts & Heritage Program. Folk Arts & Heritage Program Manager Maggie Holtzberg participated in a debrief on 2022 Lowell Folk Festival and is attending monthly planning meetings. She has begun identifying folk craft area artisans for 2023. She is assisting with the planning of an April event honoring National Heritage Fellow Yary Livan in partnership with Lowell National Historical Park and National Council for Traditional Arts.

She conducted site/field visits with past awardees Zhonghe (Elena) Li and Harold Burnham; reached out for updates from 18 apprenticeship teams, and continued preparations for transfer of 2015-2022 fieldwork collection to Massachusetts State Archive.

Maggie was interviewed by Varsha Venkataram of [Core soft power](#) Indica, (a non-profit organization based in India nurturing art, culture, heritage, and knowledge systems) about preserving the intangible cultural heritage Indians living in diasporic communities here in Massachusetts. The [conversation](#) was published online Dec 7, 2022.

EDUCATION & CREATIVE YOUTH DEVELOPMENT (CYD)

STARS Residencies. This year, as part of the Agency's diversity, equity and inclusion work, we made several important changes to the program. We increased the minimum grant from \$700 to \$2500 and introduced three funding priorities to promote equity and inclusion among STARS grantees. Applications were scored on these priorities as well as scores by the outside independent reviewers. The team of reviewers was, again, 50% BIPOC. The funding priorities elevated:

- First-time applicants or applicants that have not received funding from Mass Cultural Council in the last three fiscal years.
- Residencies for schools located in cities and towns that are below the state's median household income and below statewide educational attainment.
- Residencies serving schools with student populations that are 50% or more BIPOC as reported by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE).

We received 335 eligible applications – the most to date. We made awards totaling \$1,428,100 for residencies at 274 schools serving 30,131 students and supporting 186 cultural partners. The priority profile of funded applications:

- 35% of funded applications have not received funding from Mass Cultural Council in the last three fiscal years.
- 54% of funded residencies are at schools with student populations that are 50% or more BIPOC as reported by DESE.
- 57% of funded residencies are at schools that are located in cities and towns identified as under resourced.

Of the grantees, 55% are getting their first STARS grant and 18% are getting their first grant from the Agency. First-time applicants to the agency were 100% successful in this program. Outreach to new applicants over the course of the program year will continue.

Creative Minds Out of School. In December, we held a final Creative Minds Out of School (CMOST) statewide training for afterschool and out-of-school educators who work with children grades K-5. Over the past 12 years, CMOST has worked to develop creativity, curiosity, and connections for young children

statewide through quality visual art making. A look at the program and what it accomplished over the past 12 years will be part of an upcoming blog post.

Poetry Out Loud. Good news! The Poetry Out Loud competition returns to in-person for the first time since March 2020! POL is the national recitation competition for high schoolers created by the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) and the Poetry Foundation. The Huntington Theatre Education Department runs the program in Massachusetts for Mass Cultural Council. POL brings the power of culture into the lives of more than 20,000 young people statewide each year. By digging deep into poetry, the young people come to understand the meaning of the poems they choose, and then bring that meaning to life with their own voices. They learn about their rich literary heritage, develop important skills in critical thinking and public speaking, and build self-confidence. And they share their love of poetry with their families and their friends.

The Huntington team has been recruiting schools since August and have 47 schools, 2 cultural organizations and one individual registered for the competition.

National History Day in Massachusetts. [National History Day in Massachusetts](#) is an affiliate of [National History Day](#), the competition for middle and high school students sponsored by the National History Day organization and supported by the National Endowment for the Humanities. Students choose a topic related to an annual theme, conduct research, analyze and interpret their findings and present by creating a documentary, performance, research paper, exhibit, or web site.

Our state program is run by the Massachusetts Historical Society (MHS) with support funding from Mass Cultural Council. This year's theme is "Frontiers in History" – and the April competition will be in person! MHS reports that, thanks to support from Mass Cultural Council, they are able to support students, increase access, and support teachers. Regional competitions will be held in early March and the statewide final will be held in April.

META/CYD Fellowships. Our two teaching artist Fellowships are in full swing. The Music Educators and Teaching Artist (META) Fellows and the Creative Youth Development (CYD) Fellows are planning their site visits and collaborating on their final projects. We are planning for more workshops and a Final Showcase in 2023.

Year 2 Kick-O. The META and CYD Fellows celebrated the launch of their second year at their respective Kick-Off events. The Kick-Offs were hosted in-person at the New England Conservatory in October. Fellows from all over Massachusetts came together to meet each other in-person for the first time, and brainstorm projects and workshop ideas for the upcoming year over dinner.

Workshops

- Culturally Sustaining Curriculum with Kei Slaughter
META Fellows engaged with a highly requested workshop—how to develop a curriculum that sustains a diversity of cultures and traditions while meeting music and social emotional learning objectives. This workshop was led by the amazing Kei Slaughter, who is a vocalist, a flutist, a music therapist, and currently an associate professor at Berklee. Kei spoke about economic and disability justice frameworks, and shared examples of classroom lessons and music that indicate a culturally sustaining curriculum.
- CYD Fellowship Share-Outs
As the result of a collaborative effort between our CYD team and a small planning group of CYD Fellows, teaching artists led the first workshop of the year. In place of the standard professional development workshop, CYD Fellows presented to each other a technology, an art technique, or a teaching practice of their choice. Their presentations included topics such as Kinesthetic Empathy, Eco-Art, and a One-Day Comics lesson plan.

META Final Projects. As part of their program requirements, META Fellows work together on group projects that address a lack or need for other teaching artists. Fellows are given project funds and mentorship to help complete their projects, though Fellows spearhead their own initiatives. Final project topics include a blog for mental health in music, a rhythm-learning online resource centered on accessibility for students with disabilities, and a curriculum for teaching and transcribing African American spirituals and history. These projects will be presented at the Final Showcase

Final Showcase. In celebration of our Fellows and teaching artists in general, we are planning for the Final Showcase with Chris Rodriguez, a META Fellow and teaching artist from Zumix, and a small planning committee of CYD Fellows. The Final Showcase will take place on May 6, 2023 at Zumix in East Boston. Chris envisions it to be a “community day for teaching artists,” where the building will be filled with workshops run by teaching artists and guests, who include arts administrators, funders, elected officials, and youth performers. Attendees will experience first-hand the space where this important work happens. This is a chance for people to learn more about the important role that teaching artists play in CYD and to celebrate their achievements and creativity.

YouthReach. The CYD Team recently completed our analysis of the FY22 Final Reports for YouthReach, which will be published on the blog in the coming weeks. Through our analysis each year we report back to our field about the

challenges and successes the field is having and focus our service delivery on addressing areas of need that we are uniquely capable of providing.

Key findings from the FY22 YouthReach Final Report:

- The number of youth enrolled in CYD programs increased by 9.1%, after dropping by nearly 20% during the previous fiscal year.
- In FY22, CYD identified three primary areas of need for their work in the near term, including:
 - Staffing Challenges: Organizations faced numerous challenges related to the pressure of staff burnout, staff absenteeism, turnover and leadership attrition.
 - Mental Health: Organizations faced increased pressures related to the mental health needs of the young people they served and demands on staff to increase their communication and support of families for issues of food insecurity, housing, and basic health needs.
 - A Need for Consistent Networking and Support: Organizations shared that they welcome more professional development resources to support their staff, their teens, and alums. They also desired more opportunities for networking with other creative youth development organizations, schools and universities via convenings, etc.

In response to these findings, we were able to offer the CYD field two convenings over the last few months, one in person and one virtual.

- On September 29, 2022 we hosted an in-person Creative Youth Development and Arts Education Convening at the Pao Art Center. EdVestors and the Mass Cultural Council held an in-person convening as an opportunity for the local community to reconnect in person after three years of virtual convenings around remote learning, mental health, and equity in Arts Education and Creative Youth Development.
- On November 10, 2022 Convening on CYD and Mental Health: the need, the current landscape, and visions for active change. Creative Youth Development (CYD) organizations are often first responders to mental health crises and have been critical sites for connecting young people, families, and community with local health and social services. The need for services with the youth in CYD organizations has been long-standing but skyrocketed during the pandemic at the same time that the mental health field is experiencing increased demand and workforce shortages. What are existing practices, resources, and innovative ideas that could address both the

strengths of our field and the dire need of our young people and CYD organizations at this time? This session explored what might be better addressed when cross-sectors work together and build bridges to innovative solutions.

Our next CYD virtual convening will be on Jan. 26, 2023 and will focus on Alumni, with representation from CYD programs and partners across the Commonwealth.

Social Prescription. All 10 of the cultural organizations who were part of FY22 Social Prescribing have continued or expanded their partnerships and offerings with health providers in FY23. For example, according to a mid-year review of the Museum of Fine Arts’ Artful Healing Program, they were able to engage successfully with 357 participants at Boston Children’s Hospital from July through December 2022. If you compare this to last year’s engagement, from July – Dec. 2021, they had only worked with 88 patients. With an increase of over 300%, we are very excited to see this program growing and to see so many more patients benefiting.

This year Social Prescription has found more of a national spotlight. In October 2022, we presented at the Creating Healthy Communities: Advancing Health and Health Equity through Arts and Public Health Collaborations conference hosted by the University of Florida Center for Arts in Medicine. In November, we co-presented with Dr. Golden at the virtual NOAHCON '22 conference, contributing to the afternoon of a “Spotlight on Social Prescribing” which consisted of three presentations on how “arts on prescription” can benefit health and wellbeing.

With Dr. Golden continuing as Mass Cultural Council’s consultant, we are also pleased to announce that we will be also collaborating with [Dr. Jill Sonke](#), the [EpiArts Lab](#), and her team at the [Center for Arts in Medicine at the University of Florida](#) as well as with both grad and undergrad students from Harvard to co-produce the Field Guide by June of 2023. This is very exciting as it will enable us to share more resources, learn from a broader section of case studies, share important work in equity and inclusion, help us gain a larger view of the current US healthcare system, and learn from outcome measures and tracking.

Along with the returning Task Force members [Dr. Lisa Wong](#) and [Brooke DiGiovanni Evans](#), we have hired our new Strategic Consultant for Social Prescription, [Amy Bantham](#)! Amy is the CEO/Founder of [Move to Live®More](#) which provides services to clients in three sectors—healthcare, health & fitness and communities. With a Doctor in Public Health degree from the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health, Amy has built over 20 years of experience in consulting, health & fitness, and healthcare. She brings her strengths in strategic planning, operational implementation, research, public speaking, to accompany her strong background as a focus group moderator and alliance builder. All these skills will be well-utilized as she plans for and facilitates cross-sector meetings and convenings to find the next entity who will house this CultureRx Initiative in Social Prescription.

As a follow up from the two-day workshop - [Design for Social Prescribing: Bridging Silos for Health Promotion](#) - we will be continuing to work with the Design Laboratory at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health. and the [Art Pharmacy from GA](#) in designing the next steps in social prescribing.

CULTURAL FACILITIES FUND (CFF)

As of December 21, 2023, 192 organizations have started their Cultural Facilities applications for the currently ongoing FY23 round. Staff is working with our colleagues at MassDevelopment to determine eligibility of the applicants.

We have just over \$9 million to grant in FY23.

Staff is holding office hours and having one-on-one meetings with applicants. Simultaneously, we are recruiting panelists to review the applications.

The grant deadline is February 2, 2023 and grant announcements will be made in May.

Following this memo are budget spreadsheets for FY23.

We are now just over halfway through the fiscal year, and our spending is on target or below in most accounts. Typically, spending lags in the first half of the year.

As a result of adding a new Budget and Fiscal Operations Manager, Kate McDougall and other fiscal staff since last June, we now have the capability to track changes more accurately and quickly in our spending projections over the course of a year. As a result, we have been able to anticipate savings far earlier than we had previously. On the attached spreadsheet, you will note explanations of changes in spending plan line items over the course of the last six months. As always, we hope to present our financial information in a clear manner to the Council and others. The attached spreadsheet is an attempt to address this. If there are any questions or comments, Council members are welcome and encouraged to provide feedback.

Some things to note generally about the FY23 Spending Plan approved last August and which are reflected in the attached spreadsheet.

- The Pandemic Recovery Funds provided under Chapter 102 of the Acts of 2021 have provided a one-time enormous increase to our Spending Plan in FY 23. We have allocated over \$51 million+ to the Cultural Sector Recovery Grants programs and additionally allocated \$2.5 million to Mass Humanities to complement our efforts. (Please note we also contributed \$5.57 million of Pandemic Recovery Funds to the Cultural Facilities Fund in last year). The remaining Pandemic Recovery Funds (about \$1 million) have been used for related administrative expenses related to administration of the Funds and the programs and related additional program costs of which approximately \$395,000 we project to spend in FY24.
- Due to increased demand and additional available funds, we were able to provide more than \$25,000 in additional STARS grants than were previously anticipated. Additionally, while applications are still being reviewed, we anticipate we will also be able to make more Festivals & Projects grants than

were projected last August. This is largely due to greater outreach and recruitment efforts.

- Since the spending plan was approved, we have finalized agreements with the Klarman Family Foundation and the Linde Foundation around funding the META and CYD Fellowship Programs. This has resulted in Klarman agreeing to provide an additional \$40,000.
- In the approved FY23 Spending Plan, we had anticipated \$3.5 million being available for the Gaming Mitigation Program as of the end of 2022. Thanks to stronger than anticipated casino tax revenues, we have additional \$237,000 for that program. Additionally, of the \$1.1 million in "organizational support" funds from gaming funds which the Council voted to use in support of the FY23 Spending Plan, we have received over \$800,000 of such amount through collections announced in mid-January.

In December, we received a follow-up inquiry from the State Auditor's Office (which they had indicated they were going to as per standard practice) and we reported back in early January on our progress addressing the issues that had been identified in the 2021 audit.

Procedure for dealing with conflicts of interest on Mass Cultural Council grant votes.

Prior to any Council or Grants Committee meeting, staff will compile a list of conflicts of interest by identifying any potential recipient of council funds to be voted on at that meeting to which any Council member has an identified connection. Unless a Council member indicates otherwise, it is assumed that the Council member will abstain from all discussion and any vote regarding such grantee.

A document listing these possible conflicts of interest (the "conflicts list") will be distributed to the board at the beginning of the meeting.

After presentation of grant recommendations for a particular program, before a motion for vote, the chair should refer to the list and 1) ask the members present if the conflicts list is accurate and if the members identified will abstain from votes and discussion for the relevant organizations as identified on the conflicts list and 2) ask if any other conflicts exist which should be added to the conflicts list.

After dealing with any necessary corrections or additions, the chair will then ask for a motion approving the grant/allocation recommendations noting that the Council members noted on the conflict list will abstain from discussion and votes for certain organizations in accordance with the conflicts list. It will not be necessary for any member with a conflict to leave the room as long as such member does not participate in any decision regarding the affected organization and it is specifically noted in the minutes that such member abstained from all discussion and votes regarding the specified organization.

Sample script for a meeting vote:

CHAIR: We will now consider votes approving the [...] grant recommendations. Please note the conflicts list that has been distributed. Staff members have compiled these lists to identify members that have a real or potential conflict of interest in connection with this vote. Please indicate 1) if there are any inaccuracies on the list or 2) if any additional conflicts need to be disclosed.

[If any corrections or additions are noted by board members, the conflicts list will be amended at this time]

Noting the abstentions disclosed on the *[corrected]* conflicts list, the chair now calls for a motion to approve the grants recommendations for this program.

Then, upon motion duly and made and seconded, with the abstentions noted above, it was VOTED: ...]"

Background on The Cultural Sector Recovery Grant Program for Organizations. In May 2022, The Council reviewed and approved the development of the pandemic relief programs for organizations and individuals in the cultural sector, to be supported with the funds appropriated through Chapter 102 of the Acts of 2021. The Cultural Sector Recovery Grant (CSR) Program for Organizations launched in August 2022, with the application deadline of September 29, 2022. The Cultural Investment Portfolio (CIP) team took the lead on constituent support, leading information sessions, office hours, and one-on-one support for applicants.

The Council is being asked to approve the CSR Program as described in this memo. Draft documents listing all the applicants and the grantees and grant amounts as determined by staff is included in the materials.

This memo details the outreach process, provides details about the applicant pool, and describes the process for review of the applications and how grant amounts were determined.

Program Launch and Outreach. The grant application became available on August 8, and CIP staff conducted 2 webinars for potential applicants, followed by posting a recording of the webinar in Spanish, and multiple opportunities for applicants to meet with staff in 'office hours' and one on one consulting sessions. Outreach efforts included the Council's core strategies for promoting grant programs (e.g., social media, e-newsletter, blog, etc.), in addition to messaging to organizations in the grants management system that had not received a grant from the Council in the last three years. Staff also targeted cultural organizations in under-resourced communities (as defined in the program

guidelines) through state and federal data sources and Google's geocentric searching capabilities. Social media outreach was expanded to include live online events in Spanish.

Applicant Eligibility.

The Council received 1,359 applications (plus a few duplicate submissions) which included.

- 1,219 applications are from eligible organizations and will be awarded a grant from this program, if approved.
- 29 organizations were eligible but will not be awarded a grant through this program, as they had received a statutory grant from funds appropriated through Line Item 1599-2043 of Chapter 102 of the Acts of 2021, and such statutory grant exceeded the amount that such organization would have received through the CSR grant formula.
- 111 applications are from organizations that did not meet the eligibility requirements for the CSR program as published in the guidelines. Most eligibility issues are organizations that 1) do not meet the definition of "fully cultural", 2) are sole proprietors or single member LLCs, 3) did not conduct public programming prior to June 30, 2022, 4) do not have any evidence of public programming, or do not otherwise meet the eligibility criteria. Staff identified potentially ineligible organizations and reviewed those organizations with senior staff to make final determinations.

Information about the grants and the grantee organizations:

- 188 self-identified as BIPOC.
- 418 are located in priority communities.
- 613 received prioritization for funding history as not recently funded, and 354 of these were first time applicants.
- The grantee pool is highly skewed towards smaller organizations. Of the 1219 funded, 445 (37%) had FY19 expenses below \$50,000, and another 176 had expenses between \$50,000 and \$100,000 (14%). Only 180 had FY19 expenses over \$1million (15%).

Grant Award Calculation. Per the approval of the CSR program back in May 2022 and the published guidelines, grants from this program range from \$5,000 to \$75,000. Specific grant amounts are calculated with a formula that scales according to an organization's pre-pandemic expenses, and the prioritization categories stated in the guidelines- i.e., organizations that had more expenses or had more prioritization points could receive higher grant amounts.

- For the purpose of determining grant amounts, all organizations were treated as if their FY19 expenses ranged from \$50,000 to a maximum of \$10,000,000. The smallest organizations were treated as if they had minimum expenses of \$50,000, which benefits the smallest organizations in the applicant pool.
- 31 eligible organizations received a direct statutory grant from the funds appropriated through Line Item 1599-2043 of Chapter 102 of the Acts of 2021. These statutory grants ranged from \$25,000 - \$1.3 million. Organizations which received such a grant were included in the review and grant formula. If an organization's statutory grant was less than the grant calculated in this program, it received the difference between the two amounts. Two organizations will receive a grant under this program based on this difference.

Process:

- Staff reviewed applications to determine eligibility. This included reviewing information provided by the applicants, as well as website and social media. In some cases, staff also reviewed the searchable databases of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, the Attorney General's Division of Public Charities, and the Internal Revenue Service.
- Staff and temporary employees reviewed budget forms and financial documents provided by the applicants. Applicants were given the opportunity to make corrections to the budget forms as needed.
- Applicants that were determined to be ineligible because they were sole proprietorships or single-member Limited Liability Companies were referred to the Cultural Sector Recovery Grant

Program for Individuals and ultimately added to the applicant pool for that program.

- Approximately 10% of eligible applicants were cross-checked against public records of federal pandemic relief funding. The overwhelming majority accurately reported Paycheck Protection Program funding, an issue which impacted their score for 'access to pandemic relief'.

Prioritization and grant calculations. Scores and grant amounts were calculated by reference to Prioritization categories. Applicant's inclusion in particular datasets for prioritization point analysis was based on availability/applicability of data.

BIPOC Centered organization-

- To qualify, an organization had to complete the BIPOC Centered Self Identification form, which is reviewed/approved by staff
- The guidelines and the application explained the Self-Identification process and provided links.
- Applicants were sent several reminders to complete the form if applicable, with the final reminder sent in early December, prior to finalization of the grant calculations.

Priority Community –

- Based on the organization's address, and using the list of Under Resourced Communities which is posted on [MassCulturalCouncil.org](https://www.massculturalcouncil.org)

Funding History

- Data is from SmartSimple and based on funding amounts from FY19, FY20, and FY21.
 - Organizations that would have been eligible for previous funding received full credit
 - Organizations not previously eligible (newly-established, and most for profits) received partial credit

- Organizations whose only FY19–21 funding was a \$500 Festivals grant received partial credit

Tourism Impact

- Score based on the organization's answer on the application. Tourism impact defined: 50% of audience/participants from 50 miles away or out of state.

Job Creation.

- Score based on the organization's answer on the application in the following levels.
 - Over 500 employees
 - 101 – 499 employees
 - 1 – 100 employees

Access to Pandemic Relief

- Scoring was based on reported state or federal pandemic relief as a percentage of FY19 expenses. Organizations with no relief funds received the maximum credit, and the remainder were scaled with no credit for organizations that received more than 50% of their FY19 expenses in state or federal pandemic assistance.
- Organizations that received ARPA sourced grants from the Cultural Facilities Fund received zero points.

Negative Financial Impact of the pandemic

- Staff worked with an independent consultant to develop common measures and calculations that would assess the impact of Covid on an organization's finances. Impact was evaluated:
 - In three categories: (1.) Percentage change in revenue, (2.) change in operating expenses, (3.) change in months of cash. Scoring was weighted in order of an organization's ability to control the outcome (revenue, expenses, cash).
 - Across two timespans: (1) impact in the short term (FY19 to FY20) and (2.) impact over the duration of the period measured (FY19 to FY21). Long term impact was weighted more heavily than immediate (80%/20%).

- Organizations were divided into 5 brackets, based on pre-pandemic expenses. In each budget category, impact was compared to other similarly sized organizations, and was based the median – the midpoint of change from FY19 to a pandemic-impacted year. Scores were assigned based on how much the organization varied from the midpoint of their budget group. This means that organizations were scored based on the experience of similar sized organizations and that organizations in every budget size will show highest (or lowest) impact.

Using the above prioritization and scoring protocols, staff developed a funding list, drafts of which, sorted by grant amount is being provided along with the meeting materials. On January 11, the Grants Committee reviewed this this memo and program and recommended it for approval by the Council. Staff is requesting the Council approve of the grants selected by staff as described above.
