
Card to Culture Objectives

Card to Culture makes cultural programming accessible to low-income and working families across the Commonwealth by breaking down the financial barriers that prevent full participation.

- -Foster community connection between cultural doers and the people
- -Raise the importance and relevance of accessing arts and culture



Card to Culture: What is it?



Community and arts festival

- -Partnership between Mass Cultural Council, three state agencies, and 300+ cultural organizations
- -Specific populations get access to museums, performances, and other cultural programming at steeply reduced rates or for free

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Department of Transitional Assistance (DTA)

DTA's mission is to assist and empower low-income individuals and families to meet their basic needs, improve their quality of life, and achieve long-term economic self-sufficiency.

Serves 1 in 7 MA residents; as of September 2022, there are:



- 630,297 SNAP households = 1,049,760 recipients
- 37,968 TAFDC households = 97,847 recipients
- 28,406 EAEDC households = 28,633 recipients

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) formerly known as food stamps

Transitional Aid to Families with Dependent Children (TAFDC)

Emergency Aid to the Elderly, Disabled, and Children (EAEDC)

SNAP Program

SNAP is a federal nutrition program, administered by DTA that provides a monthly benefit to buy food

- Must be low-income and a U.S. citizen or eligible immigrant (restrictions apply)
- Not considered in a "public charge" test

Eligibility depends on financial and nonfinancial criteria

 Gross income must be at or below 200% FPL

SNAP Eligibility Chart

Household Size	Maximum Monthly Income (before taxes)	Maximum Monthly SNAP Amount*
1	\$2,265	\$281
2	\$3,052	\$516
3	\$3,838	\$740
4	\$4,625	\$939
5	\$5,415	\$1,116
6	\$6,198	\$1,339
7	\$6,985	\$1,480

TAFDC Program

Transitional Aid to Families with Dependent Children (TAFDC) is an economic assistance (cash benefit) program that helps pregnant individuals, families and caregivers of children 18 or younger

- Eligibility is income based
- DTA provides two cash payments per month



EAEDC Program

Emergency Aid to the Elderly and Disabled Children (EAEDC) is an economic assistance (cash benefit) for disabled individuals and adults over 65 years old and waiting for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments to begin






EBT Cards

MA residents receiving SNAP, TAFDC & EAEDC get their benefits on an EBT Card

- Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) cards are issued to eligible children in a household
- TAFDC & EAEDC recipients can also get their benefits deposited into their bank account
- The cards are valid with or without a photo

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What is WIC?

-WIC (Women, Infants & Children) is a federal nutrition program that provides nutrition and health education, healthy foods, breastfeeding support, and other services like referrals to families who qualify.






Who is eligible?

WIC has 31 local programs with 122 sites state-wide that provide services to low- to moderate-income pregnant and post-partum people and children under age 5 years old.

- Immigrant families are welcome at WIC.
- Individuals up to 6 months post-partum and breastfeeding up to 1 year.
- Moms, Dads, grandparents and any other guardian of a child under 5
 years old may apply on the child's behalf.









How do people qualify?

Automatic income eligible for WIC

-Active TAFDC or SNAP benefits (not for \$0.00 dollar amount clients) or certain MassHealth Plans such as MassHealth Standard and other plans

Status as a Foster Child

- -Income (if not automatic income eligible)
- -WIC Income Guidelines at or below 185% Federal Poverty Level (FPL) (based on household size and gross income such as family of 4, \$51,338)

Residency

-Must be a Massachusetts resident

Massachusetts WIC card

- -85K cardholders statewide:
- Central-15.1K; Western-11.7K;
 Boston-21.4K; Southeast-16.8K;
 Cape-2.3K; Northeast-17.9K
- -No photo
- -One per family
- -No common identifying number



Massachusetts Health Connector

The Massachusetts Health Connector provides health and dental insurance to 275,000 people, and many get financial help paying for their coverage.





What is ConnectorCare?

-The ConnectorCare program provides significant financial help to people who earn between \$17,000 and \$40,000 a year

-135K ConnectorCare cardholders

Income	Lowest Premium
Up to \$20,385	\$ O
\$20,385-\$27,189	\$48
\$27,189-\$33,975	\$90
\$33,975-\$40,777	\$134

Members enroll in commercial plans, with significant state and federal subsidies that lower monthly premiums and include low co-pays and no deductibles



ConnectorCare ID Cards

In 2023, eight plans will offer coverage through the Health Connector, but only **five** of those plans participate in ConnectorCare.

-Each carrier has its own ID card, with includes its logo, member ID information, and other plan details













ConnectorCare ID Cards (Con't)

- -All ID cards for ConnectorCare members include "ConnectorCare" somewhere on the card
- -Not all Health Connector members are ConnectorCare members.
 Only those who qualify for ConnectorCare have that on their cards



How are discounts structured?

For one-time cultural activities (e.g., performances, class, etc.)

\$20+ tickets, limited

Over \$5, limited

Under \$5 tickets, limit 4 per family Under \$5 tickets, unlimited

Free, unlimited tickets

Discounts Should Be:

- -For admission to every regular season performance or event.
- -Available during all normal operating hours + can be applied at any time.
- -Available to the family or individual adult holding the accepted card.
- -Administered through your regular process

What other discounts can we offer?

Sky's the limit!

-Tuition Assistance toward seasonal programs (automatic qualification for

financial aid)

- -Free memberships, tours, etc.
- -Discounted products, studio time, etc.
- -"Pay what you can" model



Boston Children's Museum

Program Requirements

- -Consent to having discount(s) listed on our websites and in promotional materials
- -Commit to offering discount(s) from the time of sign-up through the end of each calendar
- -Train box office or admissions staff ahead of implementing the Card to Culture discount(s)
- -Publish discount on your website, referencing the Card to Culture Program, Mass Cultural Council, and partner agencies
- -Track and report the total number of offered discounts



CHEAT SHEET FOR STAFF

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

EBT Card to Culture is a collaboration between the Mass Cultural Council and the Executive Office of Health and Human Services' Department of Transitional Assistance. It ensures the state's best cultural and educational experiences are accessible to low-income residents. There are more than 100 organizations participating all across the state of Massachusetts – including museums, symphonies, theatre companies, community arts and music schools, environmental science organizations, and more. Please refer your patrons to mass.gov/cardtoculture for the full list.

HOW IT WORKS

Patrons use their Electronic Benefits Transfer card to identify they are eligible for the discount your organization has identified. The EBT card is used for ID only, to indicate they are eligible for the discount; the card is not for payment. If your institution is taking monies, they should be collected in the regular methods that your institution uses (cash, credit card, etc.)





-Review Resources for

Organizations; add to training SOP

- -Train all FOH staff and volunteers:
- To answer program questions
- To identify cards
- To apply discounts/process payments
- Track usage





Website/Collateral Update

- -Add your discount offering on your website and wherever else you regularly advertise discounts
- Include any relevant instructions for cardholders
- -Referencing the <u>Card to Culture Program</u>, <u>Mass Cultural Council</u>, and partner agencies (<u>DTA</u>, <u>WIC</u> & <u>MHC</u>)
- Link back to the full list of participating organizations for <u>EBT</u>,
 WIC & ConnectorCare discounts



Tracking Attendance/Final Report

- -GMS note goes out in December (reminder in January)
- Due Friday, February 10, 2023 (for the 2022 calendar year)
- -How many times was this discount used?
- Track EBT, WIC & ConnectorCare discounts separately
- If applicable, track how many child discounts you offered
- -Staff & Guest Testimonial (optional)



Keep in Mind/Best Practices

- -EBT, WIC, and ConnectorCare cards are not used to pay for admission
- -Anyone who shows up with the card should get the discount
- -Do not ask for an additional photo ID
- -Process should feel welcoming & inclusive
