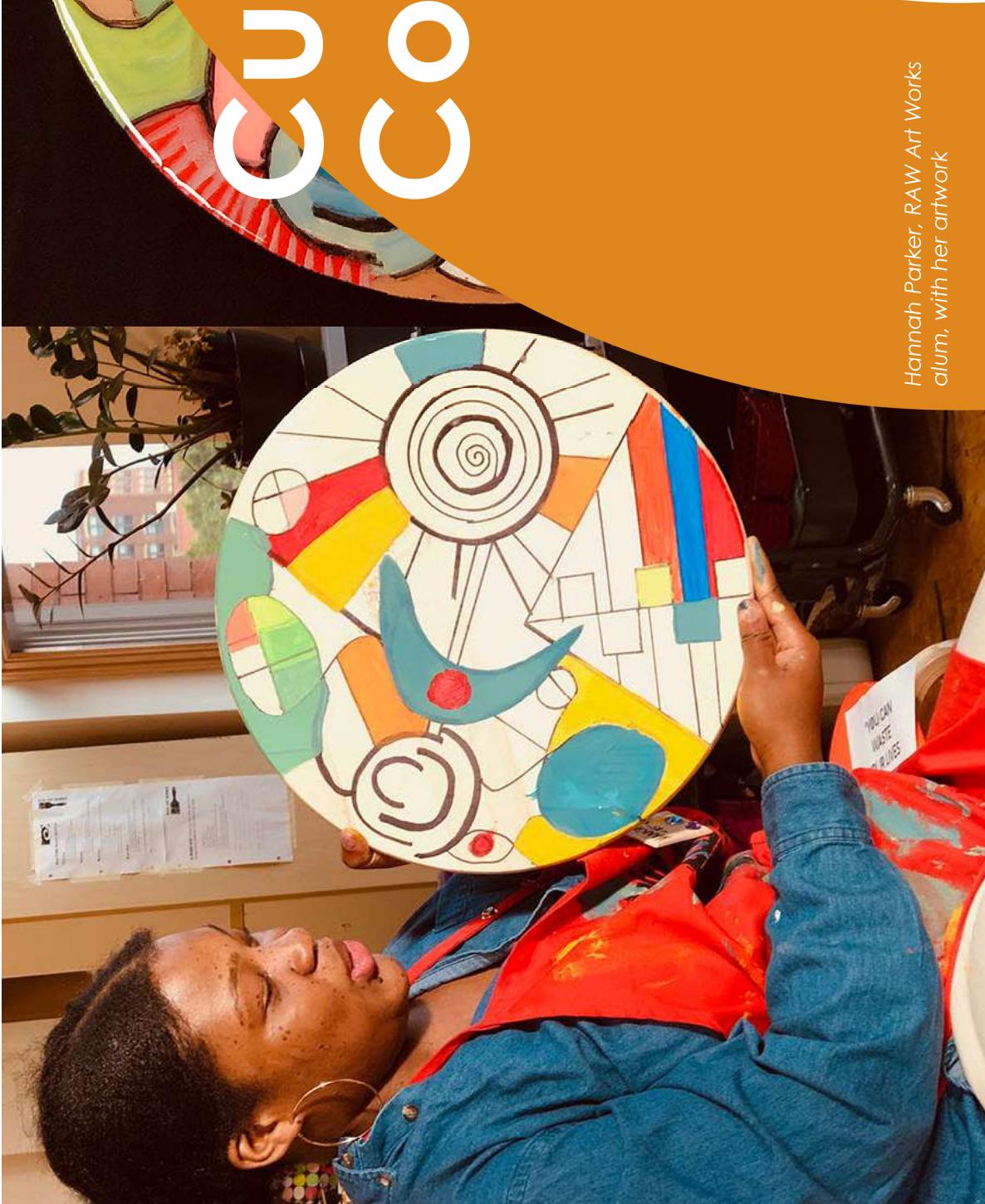

Mass Cultural Council Reach – Broadest in the Country

In FY22, we were 8th in the nation in the amount of money we granted: \$2,5721,934.

We were **1st in the nation in terms of:**

- The number of communities* we reached: 384
- The number of grantees served: 1,597

For the first time in years, we were not first in terms of the number of grants made. New York was. We were 2nd with 1,873

*NASA counts unique ZIP codes to stand in for “communities.” I believe there are 680 to 703 ZIP codes in use in MA. I can’t find a definitive answer

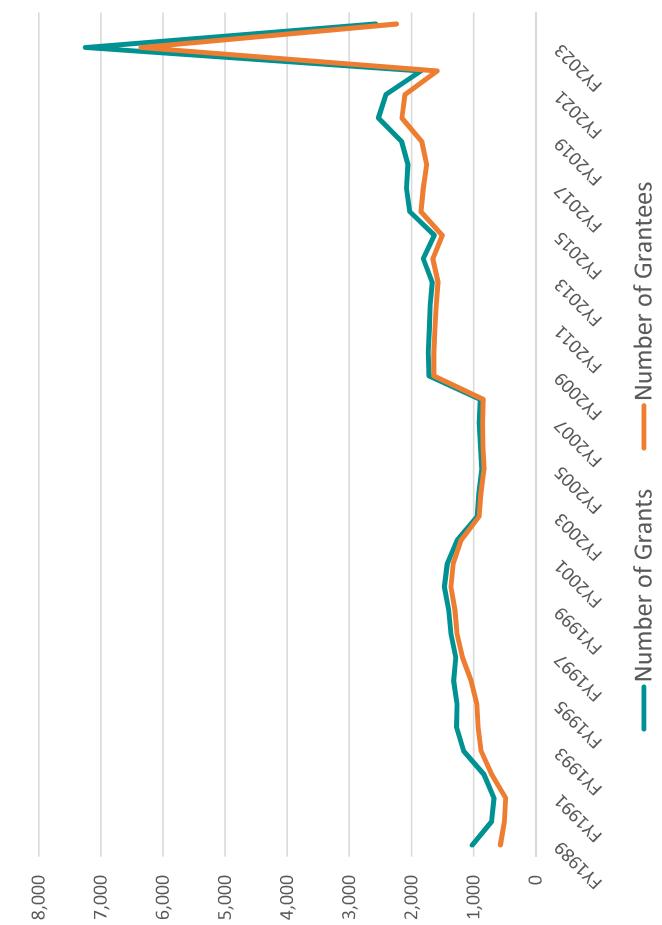

Reach over time – Number of grants and number of grantees

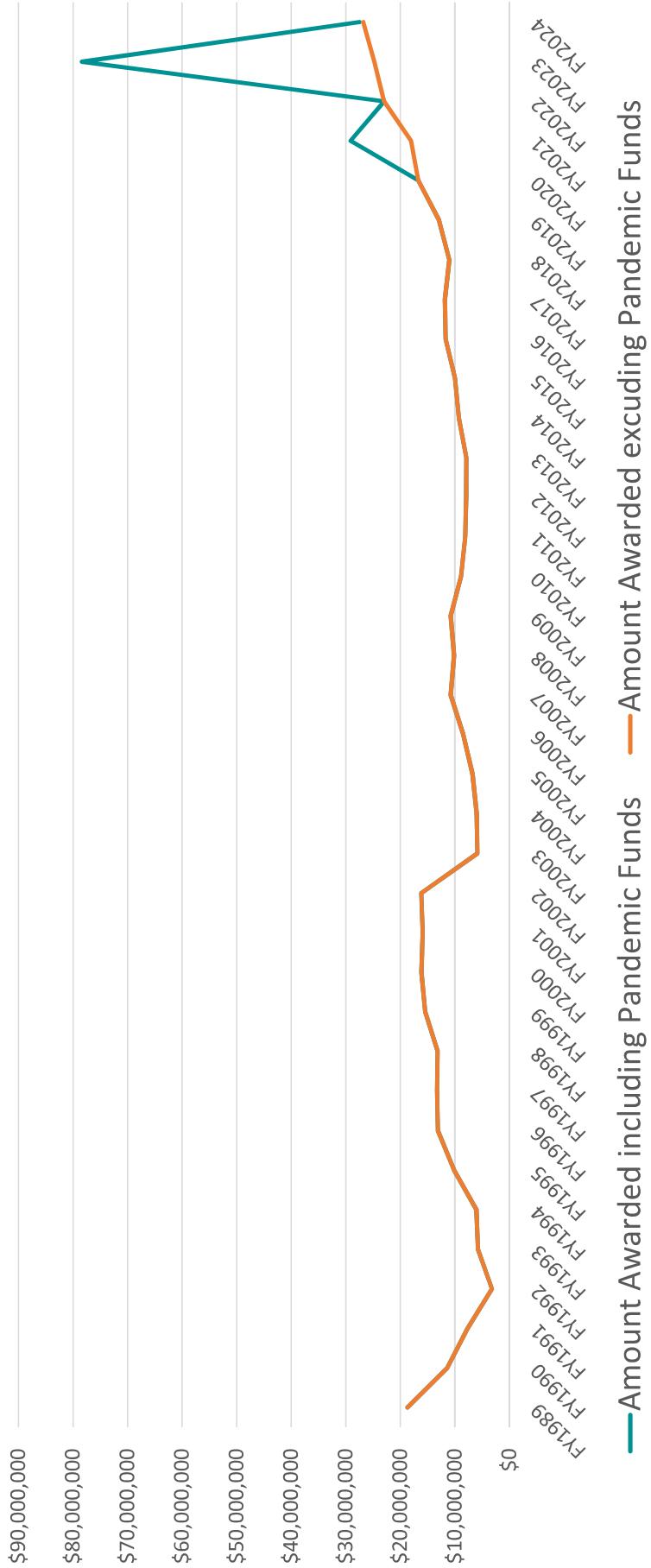

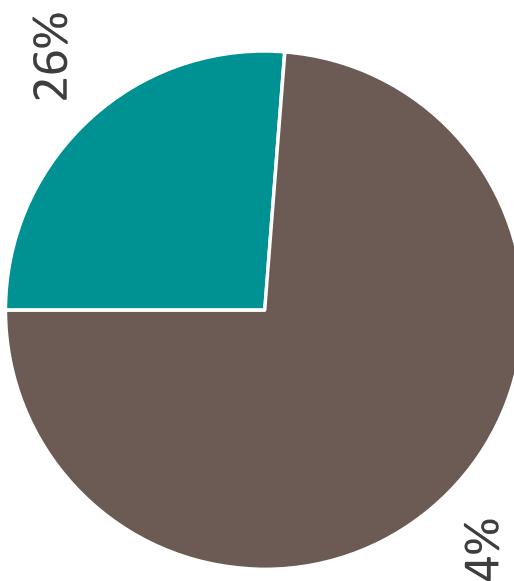

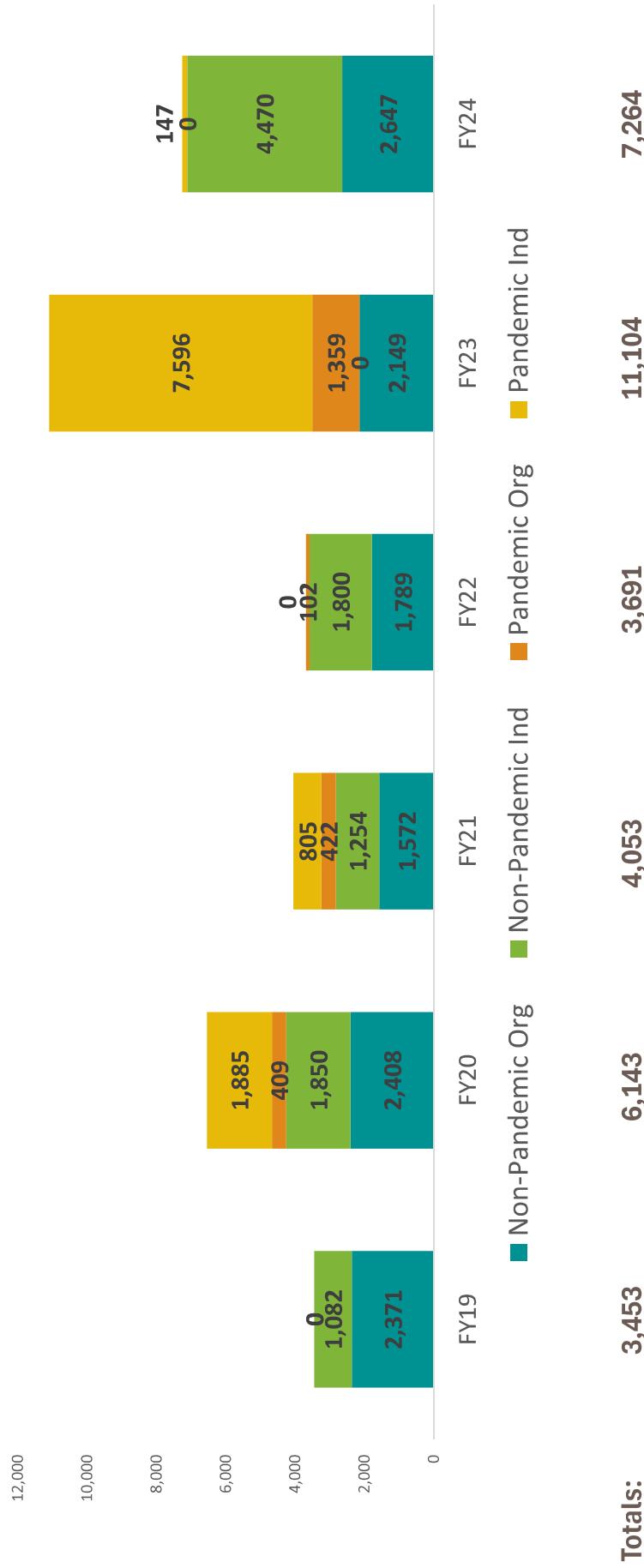

- 109% increase in applications**

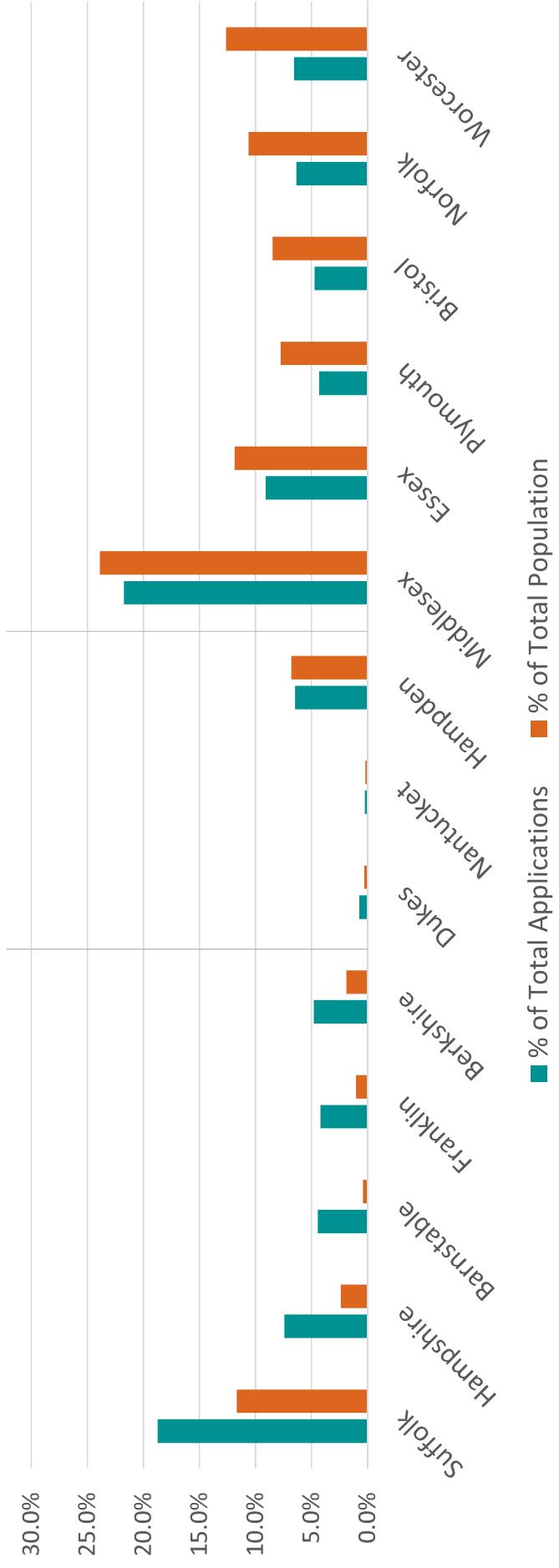
How successful are applicants? Is there a difference by county?

There is no significant difference in success rates between counties

Every county's submission rate and approval rate are essentially the same.

Demand by County Compared to Population²⁶

The difference between the % total application the % total population is no greater than 7% for all counties. In Suffolk County % total applications is 7% above % total population, whereas in Worcester it is %6 below .



Grants by City/Town

27

- We received applications from applicants in 346 cities/towns.
- We awarded grants to recipients in 345 cities/towns in Massachusetts. **98% of MA cities/towns had a direct grant recipient.**
- The 6 communities that did not have direct recipients included: *Cheshire, *Florida, *New Ashford, *Monroe, New Braintree, and *Savoy.
- LCCs made grants in 5 of those 6 communities meaning we reached 99.7% of MA Cities/Towns.

*These communities are all served by the same regional LCC, the Cultural Council of Northern Berkshires. The one town without a direct or LCC grant is New Ashford which is served regionally by this council and some programs could be taking place there even if the address of the grantee doesn't reflect that. New Braintree is also part of a regional council.

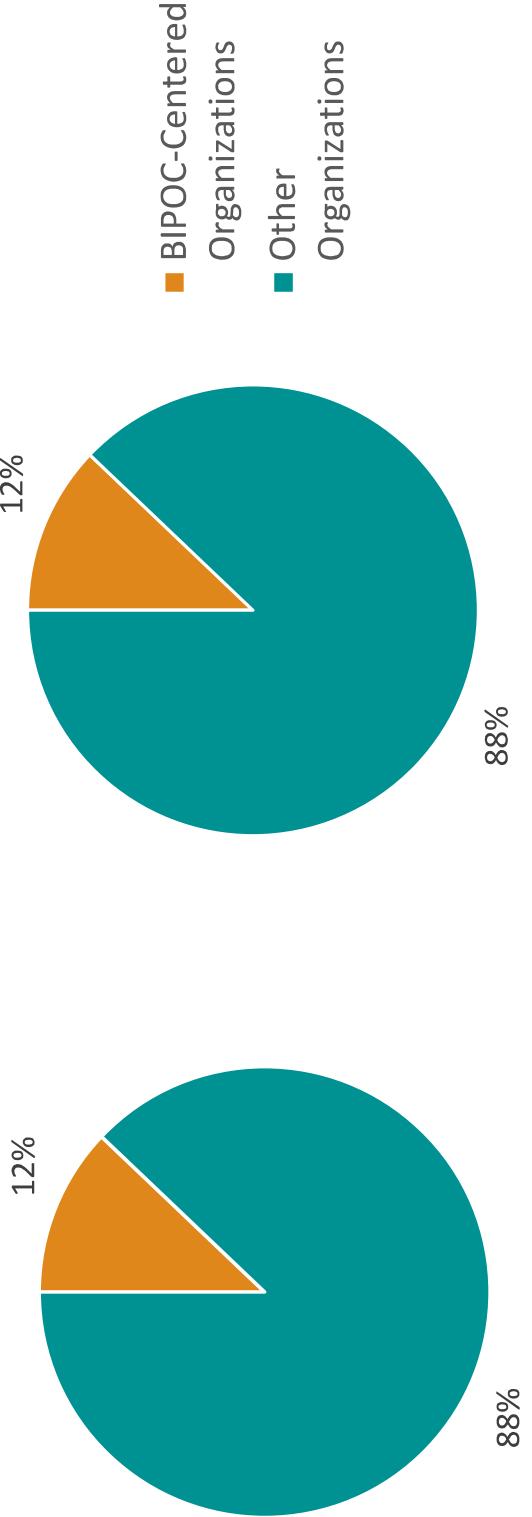

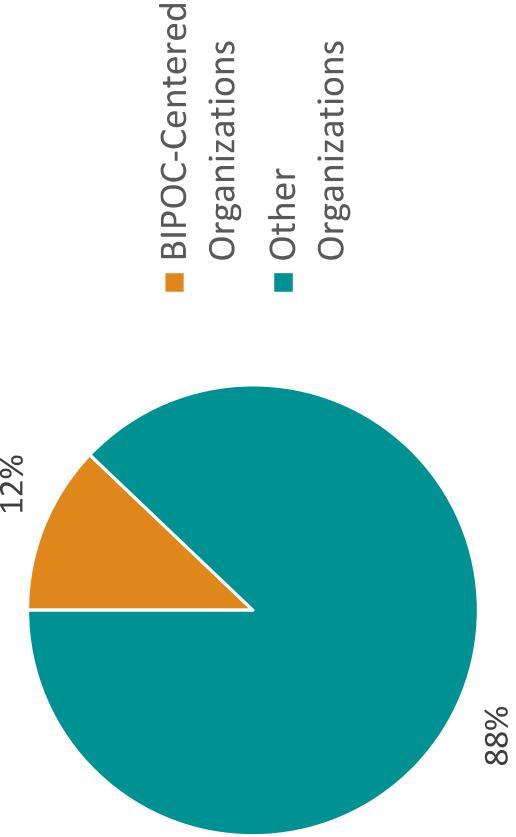

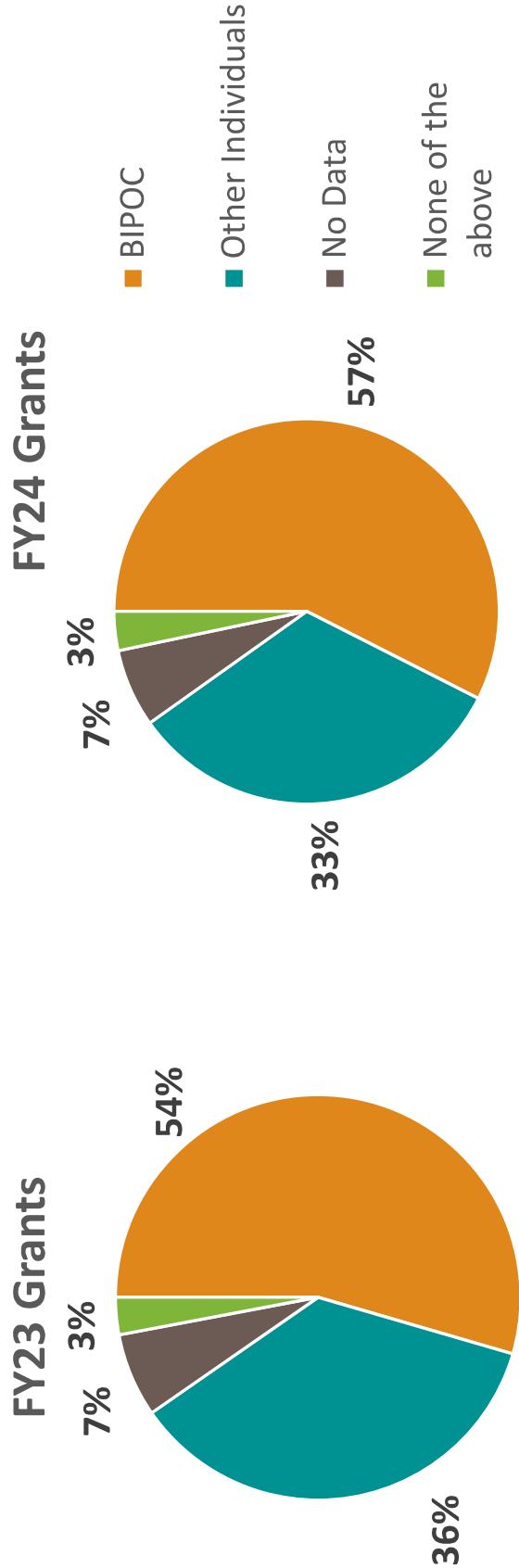

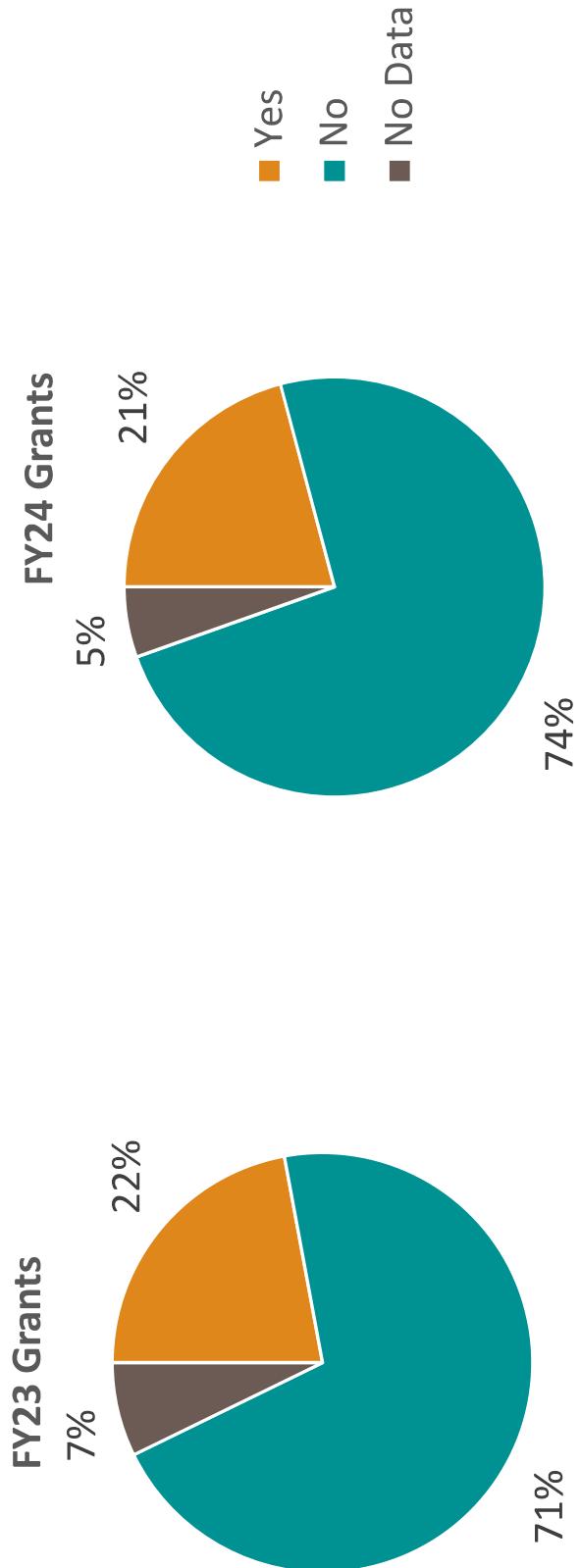

For several programs we prioritized funding to grantees that had not received a Mass Cultural Council recently:

- **STARS and Festivals & Projects:** 30% of grants (487) were to organizations that have not received funding in past three fiscal years
- **Grants for Creative Individuals:** 99% of grants (379) were to individuals who have not received funding in past six fiscal years

Focus for FY25

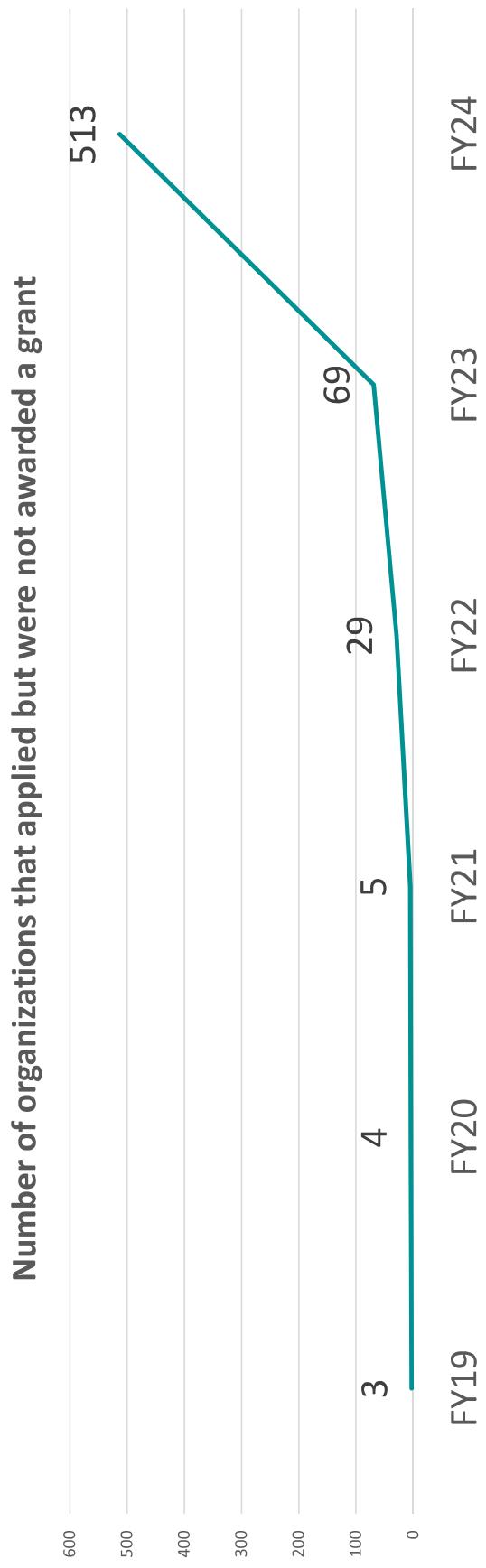
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- Update BIPOC Centered Organization Self-Identification process to take feedback from the Native American/Indigenous community into account
- Continuing progress on Race Equity Plan and incorporate new Native American/Indigenous and Deaf/Disability equity
- Review/analyze cultural asset inventory results to inform grantmaking and advancement
- Continue strategic plan implementation – including combining/streamlining programs and evaluation of resource distribution.

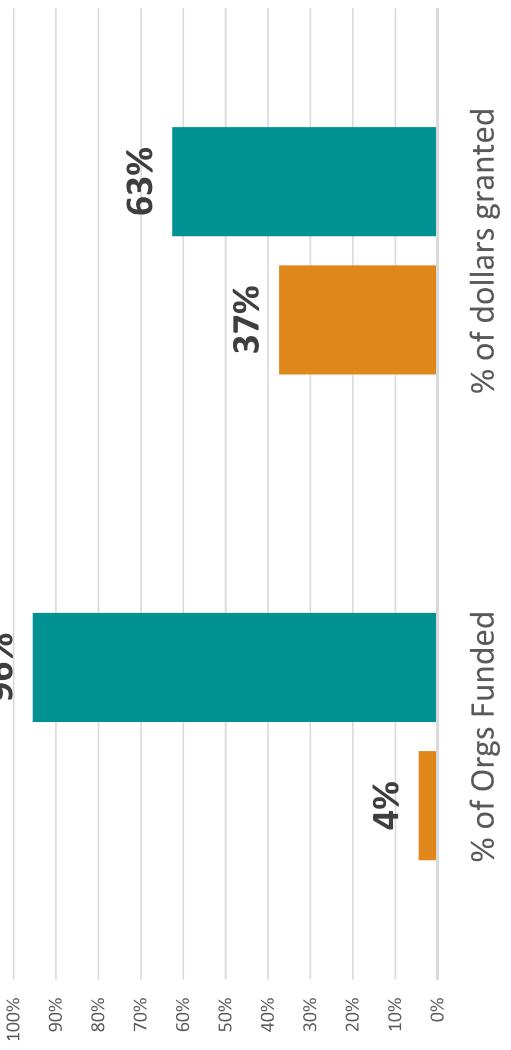
The number of likely eligible organizations we cannot fund has increased over time:



Evaluating Grant Overlap – FY23

FY23 Org Grants



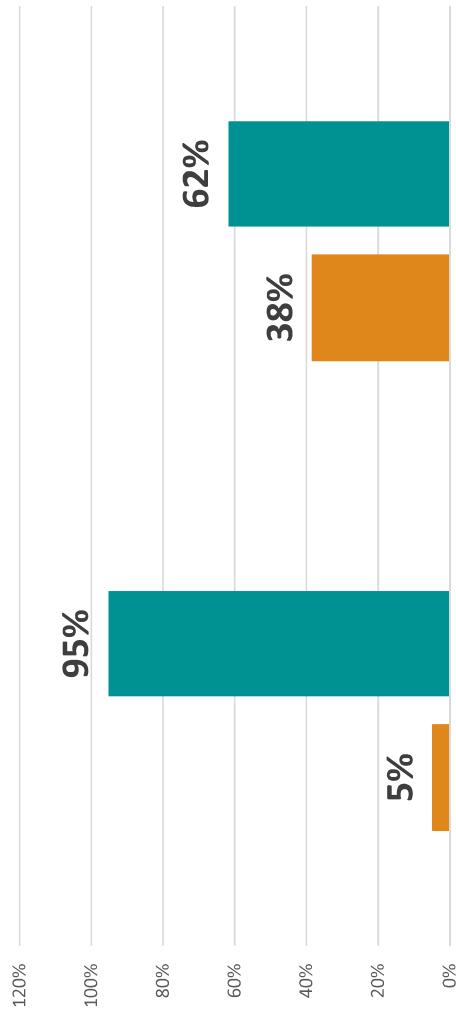
